Chapter One

“God Told Me?”



2Pe 2:1 But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privately shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction.

God told me 20 people would be here tonight to sow a seed (*your money that is*) for \$1,000!" This is what false prophets will tell their audience usually at the end of their sermons that are full of hype and emotion. Have you ever been in a church service like this? *I have!* And I tell you this my Friend,

some of these men and women that tell this BIG FAT LIE on God, are very, VERY convincing. They are dangerous!

They work their magic at the end of their sermons calling for those who are present with ANY money to come and USUALLY put it in their hand or at their feet....*Hmmmm?* Instead of the Money Line in the picture on the cover of this book, it is literally a line of people being beguiled by professional WORD Brokers. The Word of God IS their product, and at the end of their presentations, they are ready to get paid.

These corrupt men and women usually start with about \$1,000 as the first asking, or shall I say, alleged "claim" God told them the people in the congregation would have to give too them. After about 10-15 minutes of 'high pressure sales tactics' of how gifted they are in prophecy or how many times they have received large money amounts after 'obeying God,' the same way they are attempting to beguile their current audience, they decrease the amount to \$500, then to \$100.

Here is where it starts to get interesting, usually by now, there is only about 7 people standing up to give the \$1,000 dollars. Now if God REALLY told these people that 20 people were to give \$1,000 dollars, THEN there should be 20 people standing with their \$1,000 dollars, *right?* *I'm starting to smell a BIG FAT RAT.....What about you?*



You know why there is usually less than the amount of people they claim GOD says has the \$1,000 dollars? Because GOD has NOT said it! The god of mammon has! False gods and their workers always lie!! ***God does NOT lie!***

By the time these charismatic hustlers begin to embarrass themselves because the people are not standing up with the \$1,000 dollars, they begin to employ the "*guilt trip*" part of their money scam.

They begin to tell the congregation they are 'disobeying God' by not bringing their money, and they are going to miss the biggest opportunity in their life and ministry because

of their disobedience.....*Watch out now!*
Watch this! Then they come in for the kill! They will then tell everybody in the congregation to bring whatever they have, a quarter, a dollar! A nickel, or a dime! But you need to find *something* to get in that line!



They will tell those without any money, to ask the person next to them to give them a dollar or some change. This is their attempt to legitimize their deceitful money scam as they infer that they want everybody to “be blessed” regardless if you only have a quarter in your pocket...just make sure you give it to them for your ‘blessing.’

Now listen to me my Friend, this is some serious witchcraft going on. If you are not a sincere follower of Jesus Christ and know the voice of the Holy Spirit, you can be tricked by some of these smooth talkers. How? The moment you begin to trust man instead of God, you lose every time. Many people ‘trust’ their pastors instead of the Word of God and the Holy Spirit in them to discern this is absolutely anti-Christ behavior. They submit

to the false notion that if their pastors are allowing this, it must be God.

This is where many people make their mistake their own spiritual and financial demise, God told us this, “Cursed is the man that puts his trust in man, Jeremiah 17:5” This word ‘cursed’ in its Hebrew meaning is; doom, gloom, to be damned, confounded, troubled, vexed, to be plagued.

We must never forget that eternity is too long to be wrong about those we choose to follow and heed their teachings without scrutiny and examination of the Scriptures for ourselves.

I have seen some of the best work the room and if it was not for my relationship with God and the Holy Spirit, I'm telling you, I would have been looking for my check book too! That is how strong this type of lying spirit is when in operation. It is the spirit of Balaam, who was a prophet of God that prophesied for money. Story told in Numbers, Chapter 22. The Book of Jude says this about these charismatic preaching predators, *"Woe unto them! For they have gone the way of Cain, and ran greedily after the error of Balaam for reward, and perished in the gainsaying of Core."* Jude 1:11.

The worse part of this fast growing money scam, mostly in charismatic churches, is that all the men and women who are fleecing God's people and prostituting them have been given permission and access to the congregation by their pastors. However, this is a Money Game! A Scam! Everyone involved gets a piece of the money pie.

There are pastors who purposely schedule well known preachers who behave in this deception to come to their churches simply to take up an offering from their congregation to get the pastors out of debt and increase their personal bank accounts.

My Friend, if you are attending a church that has indulged in this type of hype and fraud in the name of God, you must consider this fact, he or she is a wolf in sheep's clothing. They have prostituted you. They do not love you, they are seducing you and capitalizing on your naiveté and your trust in them.

When this type of corrupt behavior is present, the false profit, *Oops!* I meant to say 'prophet,' always makes an asserted effort to exhort the audience that their 'seed' offering is to be given for their best interest. They claim

they are there to take you to another so called 'level' in God with your ministry and personal life, but you must first, sow your money into them.

Now this is what is very interesting to always note, without fail, these false prophets will boldly proclaim "they" are commissioned to take your life to another 'dimension.' Perhaps this is the very reason they are able to seduce countless people to believe them. They are bold indeed to make such statements.

When people are desperately struggling with physical sickness, financial woes and emotional pain they want to escape; they want to believe their lies because they are in distress. This is precisely the reason God is going to cast these workers of iniquity into the lake of fire for taking advantage of the feeble minded despite their lack of discernment and perhaps in many cases, their lack of fellowship with God that decreases their ability to discern these well trained, charismatic con artists. Nevertheless, if there is godly sorrow and repentance from this conniving behavior, one can be restored.

If you are a preacher reading this book, and you have allowed anyone to take advantage of those you are leading in this manner, you must repent and explain to your congregation your folly and ask them for forgiveness. Explaining your sinful behavior, will derail any attempt for them to seek emulating this anti-Christ behavior that has the potential to destroy the young ministers who witness this manifestation of deceit.

Elisha, the prophet of God cursed his servant named Gehazi with leprosy in 2Kings 5, after Elisha refused to take any gifts or money from a man God healed after Elisha told him what to do. The man was a pagan commander of the army of Aram, his name was Naaman, who was afflicted with leprosy, which was feared much like AIDS is today. Elisha told Naaman to go and dip seven times in a specific river named the Jordan and he would be healed. Naaman eventually obeyed Elisha's God given instructions and he was healed.

My Friend, listen to this very carefully, Naaman was healed and converted from worshipping pagan gods. He came to Elisha with his attendants and asked to give Elisha an offering. Listen to what Elisha said, " As

surely as the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will not accept a thing.” And even though Naaman urged him, he refused.” 2Kings 5:16. Elisha not only refused this man’s money, we should note that the man offered it to the prophet without any provocation whatsoever by Elisha. Unlike the predatory false prophets who are currently running these money scams with the assistance of multitudes of willing pastors who allow them to come right on in and have their way with their congregations provoking them to bring the exact amount they want from the people.

After Naaman had traveled some distance after leaving Elisha’s presence, Gehazi, Elisha’s servant ran after Naaman to receive some of the money and gifts Elisha refused, lying to Naaman to receive them.

When Gehazi returned from manipulating Naaman, he stood before Elisha and lied again to cover up his deceit:

“Where have you been Gehazi?” Elisha asked. “Your servant didn’t go anywhere,” Gehazi answered. But Elisha said to him, “Was not my spirit with you when the man got down from his chariot to meet you? Is this the time

to take money, or to accept clothes, olive groves, vineyards, flocks, herds, or menservants and maidservants? Naaman's leprosy will cling to you and to your descendants forever." Then Gehazi went from Elisha's presence and he was leprous, as white as snow. 2Kings 5:25-27

My Friend, this is a very powerful and sobering example of how anyone that represents Jesus Christ must resist abusing their power in the Gospel by accepting money and material things after God has done the miracle of salvation or any other. It is often NOT THE TIME.

Whenever our modern day false prophets begin to perpetrate this spiritual crime of calling people out of a crowd to give specific amounts of money to them, rest assured, they are lying, and their soul is full of leprosy! DON'T DO IT!

They want you to believe that godliness is gain, that is why you should 'sow' your seed (money) into them, which is in direct opposition of Paul's admonition and warning to turn away from anyone that preaches that gain is godliness because they are "*men of corrupt minds, destitute of the truth,*

but godliness with contentment is great gain, for we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out, and having food and raiment let us be therewith content, but they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction ad perdition. For the love of money is the root of all evil; which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. But thou, O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love patience, meekness, fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto you are called. 1Timothy 6:5-12.

The last time I witnessed this cruel trickery in action was during a revival in a church in one of the poorest neighborhoods near my city of Cleveland, OH, which is the 6th most dangerous city in the Nation.

I could not believe the amount of people who stood up to give the predator their money. He went from a \$1,000 line of church goers, to a \$10 line of people in fifteen minutes! *This preacher was something else!* He kept boasting how he was a millionaire and he carried an “anointing for wealth.” I kept

thinking to myself... "then why are you standing up there stealing from the poor in the Name of Jesus?"

By the time this predator finished working his trickery, nearly the whole church was standing with something in their hand waiting for him to summon them down to the front to 'personally' place their \$1,000 seed money into 'his' hand and to "hopefully" receive a prophecy from him or for him to "lay hands" on them and 'release' his so called anointing to get wealth upon them.

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, THIS IS TRICKERY! Spiritual Prostitution! It's a game of chance. Do you know that even a broken clock is correct twice in a day? What am I saying? These people may have a gift to prophecy, and they may speak words into your life that have been accurate and true, so did Balaam! These people are broken! They are NOT for Christ, from Christ, or in Christ. They are against Him. Withered branches that no longer abide in the true vine of eternal life, if they ever knew Him in the first place.

Jesus would NEVER operate like this,
N E V E R! How do we know this as a fact?
Because the Scriptures tell us so. Without fail,

every church service I have been where this evil spirit showed up, the speakers NEVER talked about Jesus' death, burial or resurrection. They were preaching humanism, and how the audience could get what they claimed they had, and how much money they gave to get what they claim they have. Their messages are all about earthly gain and earthly destiny, rather than eternal things and eternal life that are found in the preaching of The Cross.

When this con game is in operation, its ultimate goal is to place everyone in the audience under condemnation and fear if they do not give their money. If you don't give the speaker some money, you are going to miss the blessing of God. This is WITCHCRAFT! Big Time! My dear Friend, they want your Benjamin Franklin's and your Washington's too!! Paper or penny, they do not care, just get in that line so that you can receive God's blessing to have more money too.

There are many things about Jesus' ministry that is clearly revealed for us in the Scriptures, and 'money lines' is NOT one of them. This movement is wrong as a broken clock for sure, and when you are hurting, financially

depleted, seeking God for direction and affirmation in your life and ministry, these predators can beguile the very best of us. Emotionalism is their ‘rider.’ They use it to set the ultimate trap on your wallet.

I recall witnessing a very popular female minister who has become very well known for her “decrees” and “declares” in some Pentecostal denominations. This very well spoken woman worked a stadium full of ministers. She started her money line at \$100,000 for those who were apostles, pastors and bishops. After she first put them on the spot by first asking them all to stand, she then puts them on the spot again by telling them if they wanted God to “move” in a mighty way in their ministries, they needed to come up to the platform and touch her with their check/seed in their hand. *God help us all!*

This woman is all over the place with her decrees and declares using the same money scheme. She went from \$100,000 to \$50,000, \$30,000, \$10,000, \$5,000, \$1000, \$100 to \$10.00. I have never seen anything like it! This stadium was packed and the ministers were making out those checks! This

woman must have cleared at least a half million. People of God....WAKE UP!

Some of these pastors that allow this fleecing of their congregations have helped people in their fellowships. This is the reason many people endure the abuse and turn a complete blind eye. They will tell you they are “praying” for their corrupt pastors, but this is what Paul, the apostle told us to do...turn away from them because they are corrupt and destitute of the truth, often claiming that to serve God is gain, this is their great error that sounds right, and no doubt it sounds really good, but here is the facts of the matter:

“If any man teach otherwise, and consent not to the wholesome words, even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to the doctrine which according to godliness; he is proud, knowing nothing, but doting about questions and strifes of words, whereof comes envy, strife, railing, evil surmising, perverse disputing of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, supposing that gain is godliness; from such withdraw thyself. 1Timothy 6:3-6. My Friend, this is powerful, powerful, POWERFUL!

Any person or preacher that attempts to tell you to give them any of your hard earned money to receive a blessing from God is corrupt. They are deceived, evil, and dangerous.

I have an account with PayPal. Every time I call for customer service, they have a phone message that plays when they put you on hold to remind us that any email or phone representative will never ask for our Social Security number or password, never!

My Friend, I can guarantee you, God will NEVER tell one of his messengers to tell you or any other group of people how much he wants you to give to “him” before he blesses your life. Never, NEVER, **NEVER!**

Godliness is not gain, therefore God does not need your money for you to gain in this life, he wants your love and obedience that is better than any sacrifice.

Listen to what Paul goes on to tell us, “But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having

food and raiment let us be therewith content.
1 Timothy 6:6-7

Okay, now this is getting very interesting because Paul has clearly told us the secret to dodging the seduction of corrupt men and women who are fleecing multitudes in our great Nation, BE CONTENT.

If we are fretful and anxious for our lives to change when we are under pressure, we are vulnerable to predatory preachers.

When this money scam is in operation, the entire topic of discussion of the predatory preacher is money every time. It is about your blessings of financial 'gain' being tied to them as they insinuate what 'great prophets' they are, reason being you must give them your money, after all, they did know the first name, and address of their victims that prepared the way for their big catch of the \$20,000 they are attempting to steal from the 20 people with the \$1,000 they claim God told them you are suppose to be giving to them.

I tell you my Friend, this takes great arrogance and pride to declare such things to anyone. Maybe this is precisely the reason

why countless people do believe it, because who could be this brazen to make such false allegations about God?

Money is a powerful drug indeed. The love of it is the root to this ever growing money scam, especially in low income communities where many pastors have become predators in their pulpits due to the overwhelming pressure of seeking large crowds in their churches, desiring to be rich, famous and to steward the next mega church.

If you are a minister reading this book, I want to encourage you to remember that Jesus did not call us to be successful, he called us to be faithful. Faithfulness may not bring the crowds, money and people may hate to even hear your name, but if you seek to do God's will with your whole heart, you ARE a success in the sight of God. You are valuable and God loves you. Your labor is NOT in vain. Do not grow weary in well doing, God is Faithful!!

CHAPTER THREE

The Great CEO's



Technology has stirred much envy and selfish ambition. Pastors in particular are most vulnerable because other pastors who may have seemingly ‘successful’ ministries begin to solicit partnerships and affiliations of pastors with smaller congregations asking for monies to have them ‘mentor’ and coach them how to grow their small churches as if they are CEO’s of secular companies.

This is a subtle manifestation of pride and vain glory. Only the Spirit of God converts lost souls and adds to the real church. No man is delegated authority to convert a lost

soul, no one. Therefore, there is a question of great importance for any person who thinks they have found a method, strategy or business plan to do so, who has sent you? Has Jesus Christ called and commissioned you?

If one is not careful, they begin to lust for more money and power, prostituting their gifts from God via promotion and branding “their names” as ‘founder’s and CEO’s of ‘their’ ministries. Here again is the seduction of ministry when you begin to proclaim you are the founder of your service for Christ. When something is “found,” it denotes discovered with an independent connotation, oftentimes totally disregarding *the owner* of things that *we* find.

Church leaders, we are not ‘founders’ of our ministries, but rather we are stewards of “The Founder,” Jesus Christ, who has employed us if you will, to steward His work that was “*founded*” over 2,000 years ago. Jesus is the CEO, *not us!* The play on words can snare our souls unaware. We cannot take lightly these seemingly subtle admissions of self-exaltation and vain glory. We must be very careful as this subtle proclamation can instigate a disposition of being ‘a legend in

your own mind,' arrogant, haughty and resistant to correction, because you are the "founder."

Most of our churches minus the name on the front could easily be mistaken for a worldly "Fortune 500" companies. We got Founder's, CEO's, Senior Pastors, Executive Pastors, Associate Pastors, Directors, Memberships, Partner-ships, Covenant Partnerships, Leadership Conferences, VIP Seats, Reserved Seats, Department Heads, Doctors, Reverends, The Most Reverend and the list could go on and on! Therefore, we have the competitiveness and lust for power just as the world does in our "organizational" structured "companies" that some of us insist are really churches; but they are not because when the false prophets show up with the money scams telling the people what God told them to give, it only begs the question... who really is the founder? The man or woman whose name is actually on it, and my Friend, I can assure you 100% of the time, it is not Jesus Christ.

Businesses exist for only one purpose, to make money. When a church pastor allows a false prophet to devour the monies of their congregants, they are running a company not

a church. Companies bring in motivational speakers to boost the morale of their employees and encourage employee engagement strategies for what purpose? To make more money!

False prophets that initiate money lines are no different. They have come to clear big money numbers that the pastor cannot pull as fast because the people are familiar with him. They have to bring in the 'experts.' Experts of hype, grandeur and narcissism, after all, it takes great pride for anyone to boldly proclaim God told them to give them specific amounts of money. This is very dangerous manifestations we are talking about my Friend. Dangerous, dangerous, dangerous!

Listen to the words of Paul: But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. But thou, O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness. Fight the good fight of faith, lay

hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and have professed a good profession before many witnesses. 1 Timothy 6:9-11.

If you are attending a church that has participated in this type of ungodly, anti-Christ behavior, I want to personally encourage you to get your hat, coat and WALLET, and run for the border! At least at Taco Bell you get what you pay for when you're hungry.

This is a 'merger' business tactic of the pastor and the visiting false prophet. They have 'partnered' in their thievery dispositions serving in positions of deceit with one goal in mind, your money.

The most astonishing part of these predatory preachers is that they have no shame whatsoever, they have no mercy. They will tell you, if you do not have any money, bring down to the offering your jewelry, rent payment or utility bill money, just get in line, bring anything you have of value.

When any person is weak and vulnerable during times of pain and crisis, you want to believe these lies; that is why it behooves all

followers of Christ to lean on God. To cast all of your cares upon him and continue to study the Scriptures at all times to learn the ways of God, or else, they will get you every time. Every time!

Make no mistake about it, if your “pastor” is doing this, They Are Wolves!!! Let no one



deceive you, a rose is a rose and a thief is a thief. *Get out of there!!* They are deceitful workers for filthy lucre. No REAL pastor would tolerate it, they would lift up their rod of correction and point to the direction of the door, and tell these predators not to come back no more, no more! Take your bag of tricks back where you came from! **No Fleecing of the Flock of God Here!!**

There are those who will swear they have been blessed because they gave a certain amount of money in a meeting as I have before mentioned. Remember, even a broken clock is right at least once a day! Don't believe the HYPE! Make no mistake, these self appointed spiritual gurus promote that it is all about you needing "them" instead of Him! Who is Him? The one who has created the trees we are cutting to make what these corrupt messengers love the most - M O N E Y!

Do you know that King Solomon, who is the richest man that has ever lived, NEVER 'sowed' a penny to a prophet, evangelist, pastor, or teacher? (Story told in 1Kings, Chapter 1) God **GAVE** him his wealth.

Solomon never went to a church revival or leadership conference. He never partnered via online credit card checkout for monthly withdrawal from his empire to get a blessing, cloth, trinket, oil or "a word" for that matter from the visiting false prophets of his era.

My Friend, what I have just described is a cruel money scam in the Name of Jesus

Christ. These messengers of false hope claim they are working for God. Let no one deceive you or your family anymore, God knows what you have need of. If you are in a financial crisis, be very careful. You are vulnerable and they will take advantage of you and not blink!

There are some who will call out accurately individual people in the audience first and last names, addresses and other specific details about them before they begin to initiate their money lines.

These false prophets are operating under the demonic influence of 'familiar spirits.' Familiar spirits manifest in psychics and mediums who will tell you detailed information about yourself just the same and never mention God or Jesus. What is the difference? This false workers of iniquity do.

Here is what we must understand when this deception is in operation in any church service, the false preacher will tell the person their address or name, and tell them the "enemy" has planned to do something to harm the person on a certain date, usually a week or so from the time of the meeting they are

currently in, but “they” have been sent to stop the plans of the enemy against their life.

They will tell the person that is why God has called them by their name and the false prophet knows their address or P.O. Box number. But notice this very important detail. They are claiming to stop an “event” that has never happened, nor can it be confirmed whatsoever that it was going to happen. This is their trickery trump card. They convince their audiences they are these great ‘seers’ of insight, RIGHT before they begin to fleece the entire audience that God has now told them that 20 people have \$1,000 they must give to stop the enemy from harming their lives or, they will more often tell the audience they need to ‘sow’ the \$1,000 to begin their ‘new level’ of ministry or business.

This is their most common tactic. They want to convince the audience their money is the only way God is going to bless you, especially the false prophets that show up after the pastor has charged a registration fee for the people to enter the meeting.

CHAPTER THREE

Registration Fees?

I recently witnessed this at a church where I thought I knew the pastors well enough to know they would never fleece their congregation, but I was dead wrong.

I could not believe what I was seeing.....four offerings were taken up during the service, PLUS a registration fee of \$45 was already paid before the people showed up!

The pastor and his wife sat on the platform and watched the guest speaker hustle the congregation, one being a man with a foreign accent who attempted to call 100 people to give \$33 each to the pastor and his wife for the conference expenses*I thought the \$45.00 registration fee was for that! Hmmmmm?*

This man held up 100 envelopes that he told the people he brought "especially for them." Prior to working his \$33 heist, he had already called for a "love offering" for the other conference speakers and the tithers. Then came the keynote speaker of the evening who was a female, so called "prophetess" and

"apostle." Very interesting, it was obvious this so called 'prophetess, apostle' did not know what her calling was, this is typically of false prophets, they want any 'title' that makes them look and sound 'deep' and important, this woman obvious just wanted them all.

This woman was the last of the evening to collect the fourth offering. It was unbelievable! She had absolutely no shame nor any discernment to sense, the people were all out of money from the third offering that the facilitator took right before she was called to the microphone 35 minutes prior. She did not care, she was going to get in on the money action too! The interesting thing to note was that this woman did have a doctrinally sound message, BUT, she revealed her MONEY HUNGRY spirit at the end of her message as



she attempted to hype the people to receive a prophecy from her as she called those who could write a \$1,000 check and could come and put it in "her" hands.

My Friend, do not believe the hype! NEVER GIVE YOUR MONEY UNDER THESE CIRCUMSTANCES!! NEVER!!

Pastors like the ones I just described will 'scold' their congregations for their lack of support of their conference ideas that they imposed on their followers and expect them to pay for it. However, naturally speaking, if a person throws a party and invites guests, the guests are not expected to pay for the expense. They did not ask you to have the party. You decided to have the party, *so you should pay for it!*

Can you imagine going to your family's Thanksgiving party and after you finish eating that turkey and stuffing, your father goes off on you for not helping him pay for *his* turkey and Thanksgiving party?

The next year your father invites you and your family over again. This time he sends out a special invitation that tells you that there will be a pre-registration fee for all that plan to attend due to the lack of financial support the following year. This sounds crazy right? I do not know about you, but I would be concerned that my father has an unhealthy love of

money, rather than a genuine love for fellowship with the family, wouldn't you? How much more shall we question the motives of those that are charging enormous fees to enter fellowships to hear the Word of God??

It does not matter who does this pre-registration of financial fees, it is wrong! If the meeting is going to cost you your money before you enter, *it has not been called by God*. Church fellowship is not like a worldly concert or a secular business workshop that you register to come too. If a church host a guest speaker, their honorarium or love offering should already be set aside for them without putting any financial burden on the congregation whatsoever, who is already paying their tithes and offerings.

Greed, lack of faith, and selfish ambition fuels these ungodly methods, while disregarding the poor and the brokenhearted that cannot afford these "symposiums" and conferences. I find it very interesting to note that most of the "big" preachers are the very ones that have these financial fees and for some, you will find on their web sites where they tell you the cost of their conferences as they solicit you to pay

for it, but it's "their" conference. They are the CEO's in charge, talk about *greeeeeeedy!* It's your party, YOU PAY FOR IT! Where is all of the tithes and offerings you are collecting every single week?

I will tell you, they are spent on the vacation trips, lavish living and shopping sprees they relentlessly indulge themselves, that is why they cannot afford to handle the finances of their conference that are being held to boost more sales and attract new customers to their businesses. That is exactly what **any** church is that is charging enormous, set price registration fees for anyone to hear the Word of God in any conference. Let no one deceive you my Friend, and if you are a pastor reading this, again, you must repent for taking advantage of God's people and blocking the poor from receiving the Word of God if they do not have \$45 dollars to come to your special 'word' event.

Listen to what Jesus teaches us in *Luke 14:12-14*, "When thou makest a dinner or a supper, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor thy rich neighbors; lest they also bid thee again, and recompense be made thee. *But when thou makest a feast, call the*

poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind: and thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee, for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just.”

It must have been about 7:40 p.m. when my son and I arrived as visitors for the first time during this mid-week service I just described. I thought it was a regular bible study, which turned out to be the first night of a 5 day 'revival.' We were dismissed about 9:30pm. Between these times the congregation had been prostituted/solicited 4 times to give their money. We obviously walked in the service without being stopped for our 'registration' verifications.

Why has this become popular for many mainline church conferences? Because the men and women who facilitate these conferences do not live by faith as they exhort others to do so. They have become just like Paul the apostle said they would become, “pierced with many sorrows,” this is why they cannot afford to pay for their own events that are really planned with much promotion to attract more members to their cults, oops! I’m sorry, I meant to say churches, at least that is what they call them. Simply put, registration

fees and excessive offerings are for the pockets of the host and facilitators who are using the conference as a front to get paid....*it's a hustle!* It is anti-Christ no matter how we look at it. What do we really think Jesus would have to say about this meeting and the constant fleecing of these precious people?

NO MORE REGISTRATION FEES!! *Away With Them!!*

If any minister can't afford to have a conference, don't have it, but this is nearly impossible when these corrupt pastors want to be rich and continue to indulge lavish life styles off of the people they lead. Their conferences are business strategies for customer conversion and retention.

CHAPTER FOUR

BIRTHDAY PARTIES?

It has become a new fad of pastors in particular to throw birthday parties for themselves in some mainline denominations. They set an asking price of monies to enter their celebrations for themselves. Websites are inundated with invites and registration for their guest to pre-register to pay \$45, \$75 to \$175 per person to come celebrate with them.

I have personally known a minister that literally threw her own birthday party and sent out a 'wish list' of the things she wanted as gifts; and where you could purchase them for her. My Friend, make no mistake about it, any self-proclaiming preacher, man or woman that is doing this is a wolf, wolf, WOLF! They are abusers of their power in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. They are corrupt as corrupt can get. Make NO mistake about it. They are taking advantage of you for their own indulgence and flattery.

Let no one deceive you regardless of how long you have been following them, how popular they are, and regardless of how eloquent they are as speakers, their minds are corrupt as Paul has already told us. Jesus also told us clearly, you will know a tree by the fruit that it bears,



(*Matthew 7:16*). Greed is the fruit we are talking about here. Remember, all real ministers of Christ are called to lay down our lives for humanity.

Can we imagine Jesus having a birthday celebration for himself forcing all of the apostles and their families to pay to come and celebrate with him? These false preachers will

tell you that they have to pay for catering at their choice of 4 or 5 star hotel ballrooms, this would be the reason for their charging the registration fees that they are charging.

Some will attempt to justify how their leaders deserve all of their self aggrandizing and celebrations, but I beg to question you with this thought, “When was the last time your pastor celebrated your birthday, or even sent you a personal note of encouragement, let alone a complete celebration for anyone at their own personal cost? Does your pastor even know your name, let alone when your birthday is? You know a good shepherd is suppose to know every sheep in his flock. In fact, when was the last time your pastor even gave you a random act of kindness? What about a hug or handshake for that matter? They teach false doctrine, they allow ‘Slicky Ricky’ the false prophets to come in and swindle you out of your hard earned monies; they charge you, your family and friends to pay for their conference and now! Now, they want you to pay for their birthday party? ? ? PLUS, they take your offerings and ten percent every single week too!

Make no mistake about it my Friend, your pastor is a wolf, wolf, WOLF! In fact they are not pastors, they are IMPOSTERS! He or she has not been commissioned by Jesus Christ whatsoever, they are slaves to the Money Tree.



Predatory preachers will always find an opportunity to solicit what they love, money, Money, MONEY!

Now remember, after you pay the registration fee to come and celebrate their birthday, they are expecting those greeting cards filled with the Benjamin's, Hamilton's and don't forget

the lavish gifts they already asked you to go and purchase at their favorite top of the line department stores. DON'T DO IT! Instead, get you hat, coat and run for the boarder! Remember and never forget, you get more for your money at TJMAXX!

False prophets will always have a church to 'merge' with their business tactics of swindling with the Word of God as long as there is no godly sorrow and repentance of pastors who have prostituted their followers and refuse to warn their congregation of these evil practices, this is how you put them out of business, warn the people, teach them the facts of the matter.

My Friend, if you or someone you know has been harmed by this spiritual crime, don't feel condemned about it, but join us in the fight against these worker's of deceit. Share this book with them.

If you are a pastor or minister reading this book and you have participated in this ungodly and evil practice, you must repent and ask for forgiveness of those you have harmed. You will go to hell if you do not repent. This is thievery! Abuse, Evil!!!

What Is This?

This is trickery, a money scam. Please hear me and understand; no messenger sent by God will work this type of money scam, ever!

During his message this young man constantly boasted of how blessed he was. He told the story of how an unidentified man gave him nearly \$1 million dollars to his ministry. Now follow me very closely here, this is the seduction of the enemy, he tricks us into thinking we are ‘blessed’ when in fact, we are stepping right into his trap. The young man

said that his father asked him did he know what the man did for a living that was 'sowing' all this money into his ministry? The young preacher said he told his father, it didn't matter, he was 'blessing' his ministry; he did not know who this person was, nonetheless, he was bragging about the money he was taking from him. My friend, make no mistake about it, the devil has very rich people that work for him. He can and will prompt them to give money too! This preacher was exalting money and himself. It was evident in his mind, he has arrived and wanted everyone to know how important he was, reason being the man gave him nearly a million dollars, and then he turned around and told the people in this packed out church meeting....God told him 100 people would be blessed if they give him \$1,000 for a 'special blessing' for their lives. Wow! This is some very serious trickery going on, how so? Psychologically it is human nature to go with the flow when the majority seems to be drawn to a person or thing. But be assured my friend, Satan has gotten a hold on any preacher that is working a crowd like this. The pastor who allows this to go on is evil. Yes evil!! It is because of their evil and manipulation the people are trusting the

works of the false prophet. This is wicked, wicked, *wicked!!!*

Look what Jesus said, “*Woe unto you that are rich! For you have received your consolation, Luke 6:24.* My friend contrary to popular opinion, riches can destroy you! Yes! Jesus said this...”I’ll say it again, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the Kingdom of God, Matthew 19:24” If Jesus is telling us the truth of the matter, why would he send a messenger to boast of his riches and how you can give to him to get yours???

It is very interesting also to note: this false messenger of Christ ministry is named after himself which has become a very popular fad amongst preachers, nonetheless, Jesus said, “If I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto myself, john 12:32.” When a preacher places his or her name on the work of Christ, it is a very dangerous gesture. The same is applicable to suggesting that having money and fame is equal to success with God. On the contrary, money does not equal success with God, neither does having thousands of people calling your name in a crowded room beckoning you to come here,

there and everywhere. In fact, it is dangerous when this begins to happen to any preacher. Why? Jesus said this, *“Woe unto you, when men shall speak well of you! For so did their fathers to the false prophets, Luke 6:26”*

Now follow me very closely here. During this revival camp meeting, this preacher also told a story how he ‘prophesied’ to another very well known charismatic preacher. He told him that if he gave \$1,000 (not sure to who) but if he ‘sowed’ it that day, a woman named Linda was going to bless him with a very large amount of money. Alright, now you have to catch this, Satan does have very wealthy people in his kingdom. I am talking about billionaires and millionaires. Money is their god and for some, they have sold their souls to get it. The ‘word of knowledge’ the young preacher gave him about a woman named Linda came to pass the very next day according to his testimony; she gave the preacher \$100,000. Now, ask yourself this question? Who is the god of this present world? Satan. How does he seduce men and women to follow him? Remember his proposition to Jesus Christ? *“Again the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world*

and their splendor. “All this I will give you, he said, “if you will bow down and worship me.” Jesus said to him, “Away from me, Satan! For it is written: “Worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only,” Matthew 4:8-10. The devil seduces multitudes to bow and worship success, money, fame and the rising of their names, the same as he attempted to do with Jesus. Now follow me... if in fact God has turned this preacher over to Satan to speak lies as if he is ‘prophesying’ by the inspiration of God, demon spirits can give him accurate words of knowledge and they come to pass. How do we know this is so? *Satan lords over money!!!!!!* Linda was not identified, no more than the man he claimed ‘sowed’ nearly one million dollars into his ministry....who do you think is passing around all of this ‘success’ money to the prophet of God to swell his ego and deceive the people of God? I will let you judge. Jesus said this, “Woe unto them! For they have gone the way of Cain, and ran greedily after the error of Balaam for rewardJude1:11”

My friend, when a preacher at any time preaches that Godliness is gain, he or she is of the devil and God will turn that person over to the devil to indulge their lusts, lies and

trickery. Paul warned us and told us this about these false prophets, they are “Men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, supposing that gain is godliness: from such withdraw thyself. But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content. But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. But though O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness faith, love, patience, meekness. 1Timothy 6:5-14

So what shall we say to these things? This preacher boasted of receiving nearly \$1 million from a man he knew absolutely nothing about, nonetheless \$1 million dollars is like one dollar to an ungodly billionaire who has likely built his money empire from worshipping Satan. This preacher has taken the bait, his bragging is the subtle strategy to prepare the people for his money scam using

his testimoney, to get more money. In less than 10 minutes the front of the church was full of 113 people giving \$1,000 each in hopes God was going to give them what? Some more Money! What this preacher claimed “Linda” gave to the charismatic preacher who sowed \$1,000 and received \$100,000 the next day was the seduction of the people. Money has latent power my friend, the enemy loves to inflate the heart to lust after it, love it, exalt it and get it anyway you can, even in the Name of Jesus Christ. *God forbids It!* And he will judge all who abuse their “power in the gospel” as Paul the apostle of Christ told us he would not abuse his influence to take from the people he ministered Christ too...

“For though I preach the gospel, I have nothing to glory of: for necessity is laid upon me; woe unto me, if I preach not the gospel! For if I do this think willingly, I have a reward: but if against my will, a dispensation of the gospel is committed unto me. What is my reward then? Verily that, when I preach the gospel, I make the gospel of Christ without charge, that I abuse not my power in the gospel, 1Corinthians 9:16-18.

It was obvious this preacher was working with some very accurate facts, but the question on the floor was ‘whose voice’ was speaking in his ear to give them to him? From what kingdom was Linda that gave the \$100,000? From what kingdom was the unidentified man that gave him nearly \$1Million? Listen very closely, to what John the apostle of Christ warned us, *“Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world. 1John 4:1”*

This preacher also said God told him he was going to make his name great, now follow me very closely here, the only name that God is interested in making great is the only one that can forgive sin, his NAME is Jesus. Jesus told us this, “No man can come to me, except the Father which has sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day, John 6:44.” My friend, what we have here is a casualty of war. Satan is a deceiver and this preacher is no doubt deceived by lying spirits and the devil’s workers who have lots of money to execute his plans to deceive God’s people. “For there shall arise false Christ, and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very

And the false prophets that work these fake money lines offer you false hope in them, not God, because he did not tell them to ask for your money.

May God have mercy on the preacher I have just shared with you, may he find his way back to God and any preacher that may be reading this book who has done this evil.

Let us pray together:


